The McCallum Knights will face the San Angelo Bobcats at 7:30 p.m.Friday, April 1, at Fouse Park in first round play of the Aus-

tin Tournament.

Other first round pairings match Travis and Vaco, Austin and Alamo Heights, and Johnston and Bryan, All second round games will be played at 9:00 a.m. Satur-day. The finals will be blayed at House Park at 7:30 p.m. Saturday.

McCallum Coach Charles Minson expects San Angelo, Alemo Heights, and Waco to be the stronger terms in the tourney. Both San Angelo and Mamo Heights have experience, and Waco is pe-

renially strong.
McCallum will enter the tourney with a 5-3 season record. In their last two games, the Knights suffered a 1-0 lost to S. F. Austin High and defeated Elgin. 5-0. In the S. F. Austin game, Russell Poling's two-hit pitching went for naught as the Knights could not hit Maroon hurler Skipper White. Another two-hit performance, this time by Dick Peterson, led the Knights to a 5-0 victory. Featured in the game was a home run by Edward Parker Legg over the 325-foot sign in the Elgin Stadium.

Proposed starting pitcher for the Knights in the San Angelo gave is Russell Poling, the fast-ball ace the Mnight mound crow. Peterson, and Jerry Skopland are expected to pitch the other two games.
